PRAYER

Each Friday there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 6 00 pm till 8 00 pm You could pop in for part of that time. Sacrament of Reconciliation will also be available except on Friday March22nd. On Friday April 12th the other priests from our Local Missionary Area will also be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation from 6 pm - 8 00 pm.

If you work in Manchester you can pop into St Mary's Mulberry Street (The Hidden Gem) [more hidden than St Peters but less of a gem!! for Mass at 8 00 a.m. or Midday or Stations of the Cross at 1 00 p.m. On the Wednesdays of Lent a Lenten Retreat at 6 00 p.m. 'Loves own story – yours also.' A meditation on the Seven Last Words of Jesus on the Cross.
