Sixth Sunday of Easter (Year A) John 14:15-21

ST PETER'S BOOK CLUB

We would like to recommend Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus - a book about Elizabeth Zott who is a chemist trying to succeed in 1960's corporate America. Her male colleagues cannot get past the fact that she's a woman, acknowledging her only long enough to steal her work! It's a lively read, funny and sad at the same time. Our second choice is Cloud Cuckoo Land by Anthony Doerr which is a tale, connecting five characters, over hundreds of years through their relationship to a single book. Doerr describes this book as 'part fairytale, part fool's errand, part science fiction, part utopian satire ..' Also, The Island of Missing Trees by Elif Shafak which is set between the 1970's and more recent times, between Cyprus and London. It is a story about the turbulent history of Cyprus and communities torn apart by war, partitition, religion and migration. It is dedicated 'To immigrants and exiles everywhere, the uprooted, the rootless, And to the trees we left behind, rooted in our memories..'
