Behind the Scenes at the Museum by Kate Atkinson - this is Kate Atkinson's debut novel and it is a fantastic epic that chronicles the lives of four generations of women from the late 1800's to 1992. It is set in York and it depicts working-class life spanning two World Wars with a particular focus on the lives of women and the choices they were forced to make. Lonesome Dove by Larry McMurty - this is a Western, it won the 1986 Pullitzer Prize for Fiction and it is based on the lives of several retired Texas Rangers who attempt to drive a cattle herd from Texas to Montana in the late 1870's. A story that is rich in detail and surprisingly warm, likeable characters. Homecoming by Kate Morton - set in Adelaide in 1959, a body is discovered and the case goes cold until sixty years later. This is described as an epic novel that spans generations and asks us what we would do for those we love?

Black Butterflies by Priscilla Morton - set in 1992 and the siege of Sarajevo, Zora, an artist and a teacher, sends her husband, mother and daughter to safety in England and stays behind while the city falls.

FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT (YEAR B) Mark 13:33-37

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Be on your guard; stay awake, because you never know when the time will come. It is like a man travelling abroad: he has gone from home, and left his servants in charge, each with his own task; and he has told the doorkeeper to stay awake. So stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming, evening, midnight, cockcrow, dawn; if he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep. And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!'

- 1. Spend some time quietly reading and rereading the passage, noting the words/phrases that draw your attention.
- 2. Take time to reflect on your approach to waiting in everyday life.
- 3. 'Stay awake' ... Keep watch ... Wait patiently ...'The Master is coming' ... In this season of watchful waiting, pray of the grace to become aware of all that God has given you...and for the grace to respond from the depths of your heart.
- 4. Take time to talk with Jesus about his call to you to 'Stay awake' to welcome his presence midst all the daily busyness.
