Our first recommendation is **Cuddy by Benjamin Myers** - it is the winner of the 2023 Goldsmiths Prize and is a very creative retelling of the story of St Cuthbert across four different historical eras, from the Vikings to the modern day. The clever use of poetry and story, with well-researched sources scattered throughout, really enhances what is a beautifully written tale spanning over a 1000 years. Secondly, we recommend **Cloisters by Katy Hays** which sees a young girl working for the summer at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. An unexpected death and the girl is suddenly at the centre of a dangerous game of power and ambition. Our final book this time is **Brother Do You Love Me written by Manni and Reuben Coe** - this is based on a true story. In November 2020, at the height of the Covid pandemic, Manni received a text from his brother Reuben, who has Down's Syndrome and who was alone in his room in a care home in Dorset. Reuben's text message was 'Brother, do you love me?' and it was a cry for help. This is the story of how Manni responded to that cry.

Fifth Sunday of Easter (Year B) John 15:1-8

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away —he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.
