GOSPEL John 1: 29-34

At that time: Jesus saw John coming towards him, and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the World! This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me" I myself did not know him, but for this purpose I came baptising with water, that he might be revealed to Israel.' And John bore witness: 'I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptise with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptises with the Holy Spirit," And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God.'

1. Spend some time quietly reading and rereading the passage, noting the words/phrases that draw your attention.
2. Picture the scene, Jesus coming towards John...Imagine yourself there, listening to John, perhaps a disciple of John...How do you respond, how do those around you respond, hearing Jesus spoken about in this way?
3. Spend time with Jesus, *the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world*, in quiet conversation.

For Conversation:
